**TRAINING REQUIREMENTS** – please read and initial.

The 2017 Training Course will consist of approx 60 hours of classroom or field study to be held on various Saturdays March thru October. Training sessions will be held 3/25, 4/8, 4/22, 5/6, 5/20, 6/24, 7/29, 8/26, 9/16, 9/30, 10/14. Be aware that the schedule may change due to circumstances beyond our control. Details about each class will follow.

Training sessions are held at various locations throughout the Panhandle and that class time does not include travel time. (Note-the locations will be announced in advance. There will likely be ride-sharing opportunities for those interested.)

\_\_\_\_\_ I understand that I must complete only 40 hours of the total class hours offered within the 15 months allowed by our by-laws to become a Certified Texas Master Naturalist.

**VOLUNTEER SERVICE REQUIREMENTS** – please read and initial.

Various volunteer opportunities will be presented including trail work, helping with student groups, leading or helping with hikes, presentations to other civic groups (Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, native plants, gardening groups, wildlife groups, etc.). Individual or group participation in citizen science projects such as ebird, inaturalist are also excellent opportunities to earn volunteer time.
